#### QGI 2019 Block of the Month (December) Option 1

Instructions for assembling your 2019 blocks into a quilt top that will measure 52.5" x 60" (without borders).

- 1. Layout blocks as shown in the diagram (next page). Feel free to interchange the large 20" blocks into a pleasing layout. You can also interchange the 12.5" blocks as you like.
- 2. The quilt top will be sewn into 3 rows (see bold lines in the diagram).



#### **Row 1** (blocks with the purple letters A-E):

- 3. Sew the long side of A to B. Press to A.
- 4. Then sew A-B to C. Press to A-B.
- 5. Next sew D and E to opposite sides of A-B-C unit. Press to inside unit.

#### **Row 2** (blocks with the red letters F-O):

- 6. Sew F to long side of G. Press to G. Then sew F-G to H. Press to F-G. (Unit 6)
- 7. Sew I and K to opposite long sides of J. Press each to J.
- 8. Sew long side of L to M. Press to L.
- 9. Sew L-M to N. Press to L-M.
- 10.Sew I-J-K unit to L-M-N unit. Press to I-J-K unit. (Unit 10)
- 11.Sew F-G-H (Unit 6) and I-J-K-L-M-N (Unit 10) to opposite sides of O. Press to outside units.

#### **Row 3** (blocks with the blue letters P-Y):

- 12. Sew P to long side of Q. Press to Q. Then sew P-Q to R. Press to P-Q. (Unit 12)
- 13. Sew S and U to opposite long sides of T. Press each to T.
- 14.Sew P-Q-R (Unit 12) to S-T-U unit. Press to S-T-U unit. (Unit 14)
- 15. Sew V to long side of W. Press to W.
- 16.Sew V-W to X. Press to V-W. (Unit 16)
- 17.Sew P-Q-R-S-T-U (Unit 14) and V-W-X (Unit 16) to opposite sides of Y. Press to outside units.
- 18.Sew Rows 1 and 3 to the opposite sides of Row 2. Press. Add borders as you wish.

#### QGI 2019 Block of the Month (December) Option 2

Instructions for assembling your 2019 blocks into a quilt top that will measure 52.5" x 60" (without borders).

Option 2 will NOT use the 3-patch blocks or the 5 rectangles (5 1/2" x 8") from November. Instead you will need to cut 14 rectangles that measure 3" x 8" from the neutral fabric.

- Layout blocks as shown in the diagram (next page). Feel free to interchange the large 20" blocks into a pleasing layout. You can also interchange the 12.5" blocks as you like.
- 2. The quilt top will be sewn into 3 rows (see bold lines in the diagram).

#### **Row 1** (blocks with the purple letters A-F):

- Sew one long side of A and C to opposite sides of B. Press to A and C.
- 4. Then sew A-B-C to D. Press to A-B-C.
- 5. Next sew E and F to opposite sides of A-B-C-D unit. Press to inside unit.

#### **Row 2** (blocks with the red letters G-S):

- 6. Sew one long side of G and I to opposite sides of H. Press to G and I.
- 7. Then sew long side of G-H-I to J. Press to G-H-I. (Unit 7)
- 8. Sew one long side of K and M to opposite sides of L. Press to K and M.
- 9. Then sew long side of K-L-M to R. Press to K-L-M. (Unit 9)
- 10. Sew one long side of N and P to opposite sides of O. Press to N and P.
- 11. Then sew the P side of N-O-P to Q. Press to P. (Unit 11)
- 12. Sew long side of Unit 9 to long side of Unit 11 ensuring the correct orientation. Press to Unit 9. (Unit 12)
- 13. Sew the long side of Unit 7 and Unit 12 to opposite sides of S ensuring the correct orientation. Press to outside units.

#### Row 3 (blocks with the blue letters T-FF):

- 14. Sew one long side of T and V to opposite sides of U. Press to T and V.
- 15. Then sew long side of T-U-V to AA. Press to T-U-V. (Unit 15)
- 16. Sew one long side of W and Y to opposite sides of X. Press to W and Y.
- 17. Then sew the Y side of W-X-Y to Z. Press to Y. (Unit 17)
- 18. Sew long side of Unit 15 to long side of Unit 17 ensuring the correct orientation. Press to Unit 15. (Unit 18)
- 19. Sew one long side of BB and DD to opposite sides of CC. Press to BB and DD.
- 20. Then sew long side of BB-CC-DD to EE. Press to BB-CC-DD. (Unit 19)
- 21. Sew Unit 18 and the long side of Unit 19 to opposite sides of FF ensuring the correct orientation. Press to outside units.
- 22. Sew Rows 1 and 3 to the opposite sides of Row 2. Press. Add borders as you wish.

# Riley Hospital Community Service Project

While sitting at The Indiana State Fair I started an activity shared by both children and adults. I was told by a couple of nurses who work at Riley that it would be a great activity for the children during their hospitalization. The activity was to allow anyone to create their own quilt block "backwards". They were given ¼ sheet of 60# cardstock and unlimited number and colors of fabric. It's backwards because they were starting with the backing and designing on the front. Most fabrics were cut into 1"- 1 1/2" squares and applied glue from either blue or white glue sticks. It was a HIT!

So now, I want to take this activity to Riley Hospital and share it with them. To do so, I am in search of donations for additional fabrics scraps of all types and textures; (preferably pre-cut, if possible). The textures will be useful for allowing children with different conditions, such as Autism, to be able to participate and giving them extra therapy too!. Glue Sticks in either white or blue (some Dollar Trees have 8 packs for \$1.00): 60# card stock and some volunteers who would like to enjoy the gift of giving to Children. I do want to thank everyone who has already contributed to our supplies during the Indiana State Fair and to the generous donation of fabric from what was left at the Peony Shoppe after the Quilt Show.
