Women have always found ways to incorporate the written word into their quilts. We'll look at lots of 19th and 20th century quilts, and the varied ways that text appears ... some of them quite ingenious!



February 9, 2023 Speaker: Jenny Bowker, 'Pack and Follow' http://www.jennybowker.com/quilts

Jenny Bowker has been working in Textiles since 1997 - from the time she finished a Bachelor of Arts Degree (Visual) and decided to make just one quilt.

Her background - life before quilts - was in science. She is moving towards a melding of her fine art work and her textile work. She is interested in the way patterns come into many parts of our lives and often includes some geometrical piecing in her work as she



thinks it keeps her technically on her toes and provides a key for traditional quilters to link to her work.

She has four children and a very supportive husband who worked as a diplomat for the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. While following him she lived for a total of fifteen years

in Arab and Islamic countries. This might seem irrelevant to quilting, but has influenced her subject matter and much of her work reflects her love of the Middle East. I have lived in Syria, Western Samoa, Malaysia, Jordan, Jerusalem and Egypt.



She teaches and really enjoys it. There is no greater delight than to offer tools to a quilter who wants to make original work but doesn't know how to access her own ideas.

Let's Get 2023 Started with a Bang! By Pam Durant

The theme for QGIN in 2023 is Exceed Expectations. How can we accomplish this? Well on January 6th, you can begin to do this from the privacy of your own home. QGIN Workshops

A great way QGIN will exceed expectations is by having at least two (and more details on others) workshops in 2023. Right now the workshops are scheduled on the first Saturday of the month following our meeting, but this could change for some workshops in the future depending on site availability and member flexibility

Workshops Location: The Zionsville Town Hall is a **new venue** for workshops. We will meet at 1100 W. Oak St., Room 207 (2nd Floor, elevator available) in Zionsville. Plan on arriving about 9am, with the workshops beginning at 9:30am. Lunch? You can bring your own, or make a run to many nearby restaurants. McDonalds, Subway and Starbucks are within walking distance of Town Hall. Papa John's Pizza and Rice Cooker are also nearby.

February 4th Workshop: Mock Molas by Alice Ridge CORRECTION

To sign up click on Events on the opening page of our website (**quiltguildindy.net**) click on Events, then Workshops. Cost: **\$45** for this half day (plus) class, **includes the kit fee** with everything you need for the class. You will learn Alice's special technique with her unique combination of felt, flannel, and thread work. This is a handwork class, no machine required. Bring a small pair of scissors that are sharp right to the tip of the blades.

Alice will bring a wide variety of her Mock Molas for you to make a great gift, or something for yourself. She will be with us for four hours to give us a good start, but we have the room until 4 pm, so we can keep sewing and visiting (and encouraging) with each other all afternoon.

Please sign up as soon as possible, so we can make this happen.

April 8^h Workshop: Sea Glass by Pam Durant and Maureen Weflen

Sign up now through the Events, Workshops section of our QGI website. Cost: **\$20**. Start thinking about the beach you want to create and start collecting possible fabric from your stash and even pick up an odd fat quarter between now and then. Fabric choices? Think batiks, and other soft colors (see Sea Glass handout included with your registration). Totally up to you, since you're the one combing the beach and picking up little chunks of glass.

The glass? Little squares of pastels in your chosen colors. Plan on bringing extra to trade with others and any leftover bits of fabric with fusible on the back you are willing to share.

The Sand? It is easy to just think of sand as beige. Real beaches come in a wide variety of colors. Maureen has a collection of white/tan (Normandy, France), black (Iceland), light orange (Sahara, Tunisia), red orange (Namibia, Africa), and grey (Bali). Sand is also light green (Hawaii), bright white (Clearwater Beach), yellow-orange (Porto Ferro), pink (Bahamas),and even purple (Pfeiffer State Beach), Sand's color comes from its mineralogy or the physical structure of the crystals that dominate the sand. <u>https://www.travelchannel.com/interests/beaches/photos/unusually-colored-beaches</u>

Thank You Block for Maureen Weflen, 2022 QGI President

For anyone who would like to make a president's block for Maureen as a thank you for her leadership of QGI in 2022, here are the instructions for Mo's Plus Block!

This is a simple, two color 6 1/2" block: use <u>white</u> for the 4 background squares and <u>one</u> bright solid color for the plus.

- Cut 4 solid white fabric patches measuring 2 1/2" square.
- Cut 2 solid colored fabric patches measuring 2 1/2" square.
- Cut 1 solid colored patch measuring 6 1/2" x 2 1/2".

Assemble as pictured on the right. Block will be 6 1/2" unfinished.

you're comfortable machine-quilting on your domestic machine), those post-holiday weeks can be a good time to get in some charity work. We've got about a dozen "nice" charity tops, with backings, ready for quilting. Call Mary to arrange for pick-up or delivery.

Even if you can't attend a work day in person, there are plenty of ways you can contribute your efforts at home. We have kits ready to make quilt tops, and a good number of sandwiched quilts which require either hand-tying or machine tacking to be finished. These items can be picked up at meetings or delivered to your home! Call or text Mary Strinka and we'll make sure you have enough to keep busy during these long winter evenings.

QGI Whisper Quilt Project 2023 – A Collaborative Quilt Art Project

Overview of the QGI WQP:

Kim Caskey, quilt artist, spoke at the QGIN meeting in early November on the topic "World Wide Whispers– A Collaborative Quilt/Fiber Art Project." Betsy LaBell, QGI's President for 2023, was so intrigued with and excited by this project that she wanted The Quilters Guild of Indianapolis to offer this experience to our guild members. The project is fashioned after the children's party game Telephone, where the leader starts by whispering a sentence in the ear of the next child and the sentence is passed around the room one person at a time. The sentence evolves and changes from the original sentence as it goes along. It is guaranteed that by the time the last child reveals the "secret," it has changed a great deal. It may not even resemble the original statement. This game is known in Scotland as Chinese Whispers. The Quilt Guild in Scotland, led by Ann Hill, held a Chinese Whispers challenge a few years ago and it was a huge success. It was great fun to see how the changes occurred from beginning to end in each piece. When Ann Hill introduced this idea to Kim Caskey and other fellow quilting friends from around the world, they agreed to participate in what is now known as "World Wide Whispers". To ensure this challenge works effectively, participants must keep their work a secret. Finished pieces must not be shown to anyone before the reveal date at the end of the project.

Artist #1 of each group will get a photo. They will use this photo as the inspiration for their small wall quilt. Artist #1 will then send a photo of their finished small wall quilt to Artist #2 who will use that photo of the previous quilt as their inspiration. The theme of this collaboration is how we, as artists, are inspired and motivated to make work of our own by looking at the works of others. It is about creativity sparked by a line, a texture, a color, a form, a stitch, an embellishment, an emotion or a story. Only Artist #1 of each group will see the original photo before the reveal at the end of the Project.

How the QGI WQP works:

• Submit a photo that may be chosen to be one of the inspiration photos by January 16, 2023. This is not a requirement for participation in the WQP. It is just an opportunity for everyone to participate.

• Sign up to become part of the QGI WQP no later than January 20, 2023, by sending the following information to the Coordinator. You will receive a registration confirmation withing three working days.

Email Address

State if you would like to commit to one group only or more than one group

List all months you can commit to completing your quilt

• If you are not a able to sign up by January 26, does not mean that you cannot join in on the fun. If you want to join in later, send your information to the Coordinator and she will do her best to add you to a group or fill in if someone has to withdraw from the project.

• The Coordinator will divide the participants into groups and assign each participant a month. The month will be based on participant's available months.

• By January 27, 2023, the Coordinator will publish the group listings that will include the participants in each group and their month assignment on the website and send all participants an email with the same information. If any registered participant has issues with the list, please contact the Coordinator.

• By January 28, 2023, the Coordinator will send a photo to Artist #1 for each group and Artist #1 can start the project. Artist #1 must acknowledge the receipt of the photograph when it arrives to the Coordinator.

• Each participant will start their quilt on the 1st day of the month assigned and will send, via email, a photograph of their finished wall hanging quilt along with a written statement about the quilt to the next artist in the group by the 28th day of the same month. The Coordinator must be copied on this email. It is crucially important to adhere to the timeline. If you have concerns about not being able to fulfill your commitment to

participate in your month, please contact the Coordinator immediately so she can swap you with someone else in the group.

• Note: You are sending a photograph of your quilt. It is OK if there is no quilting or binding/ facing done at that time. The design of the quilt is what is important. You have until November 9, 2023, to quilt, bind/face, and attach the label and sleeve. This should take some of the pressure off you to complete the quilt.

• The Coordinator will check monthly that the photos have been forwarded by the date due. The forwarding of the photos and statement must be done by the 28th. However, photographs of finished pieces can be sent to the next participant earlier than the due date.

• Commit to completing your quilt, photographing it, writing an artist statement about your quilt and emailing the picture of your quilt and your statement to the next quilter in your group and the Coordinator by the end of your assigned month.

• Upon completion of the wall quilt, each participant will keep the quilt in their possession. In November 2023 the participants will deliver their completed wall quilt to the Coordinator for display at the reveal.

• At the end of the project all of the wall quilts made by all the participants in all of the groups will be revealed at the December 2023 QGI Holiday Party.

• The unique challenge of this project is to keep the work a complete secret until the reveal day. Of course, it is always difficult to keep a secret, but please be reminded that this project will only work as anticipated when none of the small wall quilts have been shown before the reveal date.

Special Notice: All communications for this project will be via email. If you are unable to communicate by email, please contact the coordinator to make special arrangements.

Why Participate in the QGI WQP Project

- To challenge yourself with new methods of quilting
- To improve your artistic and quilting skills
- To encourage friendships through the craft of quilting
- To have fun quilting
- To exhibit the finished project pieces as part of a group

Rules for the QGI WQP:

• Quilts must measure 18" by 24". The landscape or portrait orientation for each group will be designated by the Coordinator based on the inspiration photo. This is a small sized wall quilt so you can complete it within your assigned month.

• At the time of the reveal, the wall quilt must be finished with either a binding or a facing.

• The small wall quilt must be a quilt. Three layers and quilted/stitched together. It is preferable that each participant quilts their own work but, if the participant choses to have another person quilt their wall quilt, that person must be sworn to secrecy. The "Whisper Quilt Project" police will be watching.

• The label on the back side should contain:

Name of project: QGI Whisper Quilt Project 2023

Title of the small wall quilt

Artist statement about the piece, including what inspired your piece

Artist name and the date of completion

Techniques used and any other relevant information

•At the time of the reveal, there must be a 4" hanging sleeve leaving 1" gap at each end of each sleeve; top sleeve position 1" down from top edge. This will ensure that all of the quilts will hang evenly when displayed.

• DO NOT share your small quilt with other QGI members or anyone else until the big reveal at the 2023 December QGI Holiday Party.

• Do NOT post your QGI Whisper Quilt on social media until AFTER the big reveal at the 2023 December QGI Holiday Party.

• Commit to entering your quilt in the next QGI quilt show (hopefully in 2024). No registration fee will be required for this entry.

• Be creative and have fun!

How you can participate?

• You can register to be part of a group and make a quilt or

- Anyone may submit a photo, including participants, that may be chosen to be one of the inspiration photos
- The photo should represent something from the Indianapolis area

• The photo must be high enough resolution for a large print to display with the project. If you use your phone, submit the highest resolution available.

• Email your high-resolution photo to the Coordinator by January 16, 2023. Please mention the location or other pertinent information about the photo in your email.

• The photo(s) used will be enlarged and displayed with the quilts at the big reveal at the 2024 QGI Quilt Show.

The Big Reveal

• The big reveal will take place at the 2023 December QGI Holiday Party.

• The quilts will be shown as a Special Exhibit at the next QGI Quilt Show. No registration fee will be required for this entry.

2023 WQP Calendar

- 01/13/23 Zoom meeting for anyone who has questions, wants more information or needs clarification about the WQP. The time of the Zoom will be announced later and will be recorded and posted on the website.
- 01/16/23 Closing date for photo submissions
- 01/26/23 Closing date for artist sign up for January 2023 participation. Artist signups will be accepted through April 15 for months later in the year.
- 01/27/23 The Coordinator will email a notification to each participating artist that will include the members of their group and their artist number and month assignment. If an artist has any issue with and part of the information sent in the notice, the artist should immediately contact the Coordinator so whatever changes necessary can be made.
- 01/28/23 The Coordinator will send a photo to Artist #1 in each group and work on the quilt may begin the 28th of each following month artist will email a photo of their completed quilt and their artist's statement to the next artist in their group and to the Coordinator.


