April Guest speaker: Maria Shell (mariashell.com) presenting from Anchorage Alaska

Tradition, ART, Modern - Notes from the Field

Maria asked – What kind of quilter are you?

She submitted her first quilts to QultCon in 2015 and all 6 submissions were rejected. It was very discouraging for her. She questioned whether her style of quilting was labeled incorrectly and if she should try a different venue.

Traditional definition of a quilt – 3 layers stitched together. Historically exhibits at State Fairs, craft is the emphasis, looking for precision (points match) etc.

Art Quilt (Studio Art Quilt Assoc definition) – creative visual work that is layered and stitched or that references this form of stitched layered structure. They are intended to be placed on a wall to look at. Often identify more closely with fiber artistes than traditional quilt makers. Visual artist, fiber artist, avoid the word quilt

In schools that offered Master of Fine Art – they encompassed mediums of glass, wood, and fiber which included soft sculptures, weaving but not quilting (they had no expertise).

Modern quilts were influenced by Molly Upton Blades, Jean Ray Laury, Nancy Crow, and Gayle Pritchard. Maria applied for and received a Grant to study with Nancy Crow for 3 weeks. (focus on color, pattern and repetition).

In the book, "Art Quilts Unfolding", one of her rejected quilts from QuiltCon was published.

Modern quilts are primarily functional, they use bold colors, prints, high contrast, minimalism and expansive negative space and alternate grid work.

As a 21st century quilter – Don't let definitions define you.

QGI Daytime Program - Friday, May 7, 2021

Jennifer Titus of Zig-Zag Corner Quilts and Baskets will present a program on Sewing Machine Maintenance.

Jennifer started sewing when she was 8 and attempted to tat at age 12. She learned a great deal from her mother and grandmother. She has worked with each and every medium she could get her hands on, some designs over the years have been keepers and others were good experiments on what doesn't work for her.

Garment construction was first in her line of sewing projects. From her early days her favorite stitch was the zig-zag stitch.



By the time she was ready to open her shop to the public she had fallen in love with Crazy Quilting and was actively teaching basket weaving to anyone who would sit still long enough for her to share with them. Since the shop was located at the corner of State Road 234 and North Troy Road, she put Zig-Zag together with corner and quilts and baskets and named the business Zig-Zag Corner Quilts & Baskets LLC.

Over the years, besides quilting and fabrics, her love of thread, yarns and fibers influenced what she was carrying in the shop and gradually it grew into a popular source for tatting, bobbin lace, crochet and knitting supplies.

One of her Dad's favorite saying is "the only thing constant is change" so as her family changes, grows etc. her business has changed, but the bottom line and vision of sharing her true love of the fiber arts has not. She loves this next chapter in their lives of being able to travel and teach and share her talents with those who want to learn, and balance the needs of her family.

We suggest you print a copy of these handouts to use while in Shipshewana or keep the document on your smart phone for reference while at the retreat.


If you have some quilty friends you would like to sit near at the retreat, contact Maureen at maureenweflen@att.net or 317-270-7414 with the names in your group. Maureen will try her best to keep you all in the same county (LOL).

On arrival at the Farmstead Inn you will pick up your room key at the front desk. Our rooms will be throughout the hotel as another group had already rented the rooms closest to the sewing area when we changed the retreat date to June 2021. The Inn is furnishing Maureen and Chris a list of your room numbers so we can get ahold of everyone should we need to. Maureen and Chris will announce their room numbers to the group on Friday in case you want to contact us. The Agenda handout also has our cell phone numbers in it.

The sewing area is in the west end of the Inn. The entrance is behind the one you stop at to pick up your room key. You will be allowed to bring your stuff into the sewing room at 9:00 am on Friday. Maureen and Chris will need time (8am - 9am) for set up of the registration table outside the sewing area as well as do a few things inside the sewing area. We appreciate your patience.

For those who are renting a room for Thursday night, June 3, you will need to check out of your room Friday morning at the front desk so the Inn will charge that night's cost to your credit card and not to the Guild's bill. You will keep your same room for the retreat.



You will need:

- Fabric scraps
- Two lengthens of elastic 11 and 13 inches long, can be 1/4 or 1/2 inch wide.
- Sewing machine/needle and thread
- Iron

Instructions:

- Print and cut out pattern. Make sure to print this pdf at 100% original size, do not re-scale.
- Cut fabric. If wider seam allowance preferred, cut slightly larger than pattern
- Sew curved seam, right sides together for inner and outer fabric.
- 4) Press seam and top stitch.
- Sew darts on outer and inner pieces.
 Darts help keep mask tight around sides of face and cheeks.
- Pin rights sides together of outer and inner mask. And sew seams 2 & 3.
- Turn right side out and press.
- Then fold fabric at seam 4 in approximately 1/2 inch and press.
- Insert 11 inch elastic piece at position X1 and 13 inch elastic at position X2.
 Top stich seam closed with elastic in place. Elastic is looped AROUND head, not ears.

NOTE: If you don't have access to elastic, you can substitute fabric by sewing bias tape that cans be tied together by the wearer. Make each of the 4 lengths of bias tape at least 12 inches long and insert them as you would the elastic in step 9.
