President's Message - OPPORTUNITY

March 19, 2022, is National Quilting Day! The third Saturday of March was designated as National Quilting Day back in 1991 by the National Quilting Association (NQA). Although the NQA no longer exists, in past years our guild has held a voluntary gathering of members on that day to work on making quilts for charitable organizations in the Indianapolis area. That type of gathering all came to an end when Covid reared its ugly head. But we can still make a difference as a group. Read on.

The two activities I enjoy doing for charity is putting binding on finished quilts and making pillowcases. For 2022 I would like to offer an OPPORTUNITY to challenge us to make a pillowcase on behalf of every member of our guild! We currently have 225 paid members. There are two ways we can all participate in this challenge.

- 1. Sew one pillowcase from fabrics in your stash. See the next page for instructions. These pillowcases can be given to me in March at all the locations/times listed below.
- 2. I am willing to sew all the pillowcases myself if you participate in this challenge by bringing me the fabrics for one pillowcase as follows:

Main Piece: 27" wide x WOF (usually 40-42") Border Piece: 10" wide x WOF Accent Piece: 3" wide x WOF

AN EASY WAY TO MAKE A PILLOWCASE

Cut Fabrics as follows: Main Piece: 27" wide x WOF (usually 40-42") Border Piece 10" wide x WOF Accent Piece 3" wide x WOF

1. Lay 10" border piece of fabric face up on work surface.

2. Lay 27" main piece of fabric face up on top of border piece. Line up raw edges.

3. Fold accent piece in half lengthwise and press. Lay accent piece of fabric on top of main fabric. Line up all raw edges.

4. Roll the main fabric from the bottom up to just below the accent piece.

5. Bring the bottom edge of the border piece up and over the top main piece of fabric, matching and pinning all the raw edges together.

6. Stitch a seam along the pinned edge. Turn the tube of fabric inside out and like magic your pillowcase is almost finished with no raw edges showing along the top.

7. Finish the side and bottom seams with a "French Seam." A French seam is done by putting the **wrong** sides together and sewing a scant 1/4" seam along the side and bottom of the pillowcase. Then put the **right** sides together and sew a 1/2" seam enclosing the raw edges

We recognize that this year is the **44th birthday** of the **Quilting Guild of Indianapolis** and sang happy birthday to the quilters born in February plus to all of us in the guild.

Announcements:

- Betsy LaBelle (V.P) invited the new members and guests to introduce themselves.
- Maureen highlighted opportunities that members have to help the Guild
 - Sell Quilt Show T-shirts and pins at the in-person meetings
 - Sew charity quilts or pillowcases, pre-cut kits available to pick-up
 - The Quilt Show committee needs volunteers to help with the Peony (resale) shop
- The challenge quilt for the Quilt Show is 'Unspoken Messages'. Let your creative juices flow and design a quilt without words that sends or gives a message. Rules can be found on the QGI website. <u>https://www.quiltguildindy.net</u> under the Quilt Show button on Home page
- Chris Hurley -Quilts of Valor representative shared that the in-person work day in Greenwood yielded 8 finished tops. The next work day is planned for the Noblesville VFW. The organization selects a block each year for people to make and then these like blocks are donated and assembled into quilts. (person doesn't have to make a whole quilt) The 2022 block is floating churn dash and the pattern is available on the QOV site - https://www.qovf.org/wp-content/uploads/2022/01/2022-Floating-Churn-Dash.pdf
- Mary Strinka Charity Quilts. The Guild donated 24 quilts and pillowcases to DaySpring Center for homeless families this month. Our charity quilt work day is on the 3rd Thursday of the month at North United Methodist Church. (3808 N. Meridian St) Work starts at 9:30 – 2:30. Bring a lunch. Come for all or part of the day.
 - Upcoming dates Feb. 17 and March 17th.
 - Enter the parking lot from either Illinois St or 39th St. Go to the part of the parking lot that is closest to 38th St near the bus stop. You'll see an entrance to that side of the building with a small canopy. Enter there and take the elevator down to the basement (labeled LL).
- Dallas Reed QGI-South Meets in-person on 4th Thursdays at 8300 S. Meridian St in Friedens United Church of Christ. 10am – Noon. No Zoom option. February 24th program will be given by Back Door Quilts on latest fabric trends and tools.

Sara Buchwald, Program Committee introduced our Guest lecturer (via Zoom) Linda Hahn "Rock that Quilt Block"

Linda's book came from a student that made a mistake with the weathervane pattern and incorrectly rotated it but produced an interesting effect. Linda showed many examples of how dramatically the look of a quilt could be changed by rotating a portion of a block or changing the color placement. Another feature is extending a block into a border for an interesting effect.

She uses Electric Quilt (EQ8) program to experiment with placement options. She also teaches classes in using EQ. You can sign-up on her website FrogHollowDesigns.com if interested.

She has written many books and shared that the publisher chooses the book title and the quilt for the cover. We were given a flyer to order some of her books with a discount. QGI website->Forum->General Discussion

March 10, 2022 - Evening Meeting Speaker: Timna Tarr

Timna Tarr comes from a long line of quilters but did not begin quilting until after studying art history in college. She bought her first longarm in 2001 and began quilting clients' quilts shortly thereafter. Timna's own nationally award-winning quilts are in private and corporate collections. They have also been seen in numerous exhibits, magazines, and books as well as on *The Quilt Show* and *Quilting Arts TV*. Timna is a designer for Studio e Fabrics and is an in-demand teacher and speaker. She lives in South Hadley, MA and works out of her studio in Holyoke, MA.

"My work is about color and small compositions. Each block in a quilt is made as its own element, independent of the other blocks. After all of the blocks are constructed, my goal is to arrange the small compositions to play off each other and work together to create a larger whole. What keeps me engaged is watching how the project



changes and transforms with the addition of each color and texture.

The resulting quilts are contemporary works, set in this time and place, which reference the rich tradition of quilt making."



QGI North Meeting Notes for February 4, 2022 By Pam Durant

The Feb 4th QGIN meeting was held by Zoom only because of snow and ice. Our speaker was Cyndi McChesney, <u>http://www.cedarridgequilting.com/</u>, from Caŋ̂on City, Colorado. Her talk "Panel Palooza" was truly inspiring. She had an engaging teaching style which had many members rethinking what they might do with panels they owned, and later searching their stashes for panels they'd forgotten they had.

Cyndi let us know how important squaring up the panel is before use, and gave some hints on how to do this. Cyndi introduced us to a new quilting acronym—SOB—which stands for Slap on Border. She advised us that although that is always an option with panels, it often produces a more interesting final product if you can add more! Her most important piece of advice, "Get inspiration from elements of the panel itself". She showed many examples of her own work and those of students to demonstrate how to not just pull colors, but many ways to creatively use interesting pieces and settings. She showed how to duplicate the mountains, use a bear paw block, and stars to a Rocky Mountain panel. Now we can do more than SOB. She has a book coming out on the topic in 2022, *Fun with Panels* by C &T Publishing.

Cyndi is a multitalented quilter and teacher. She does have other zoom lectures available. Her love for quilting is obvious and contagious AND she has a great teaching style. I'm considering booking her again in 2023. Does the topic "Math for Quilters", "Lonestar Quilts", or "Increasing Color in Your Quilts" sound good to anyone else?

Cyndi stayed online for the special Show and Tell gathered by Betsy LaBell. It included many inspiring quilts made using panels done in a variety of creative ways by our members. Cyndi seemed to enjoy this, even seeming to learn something from us. Door prize winners got the fabric panel of their choice and a Villa Rose postcard pattern suggesting something they could do with their panels.

As a follow up to this meeting, the March 4th QGIN meeting will have a "premeeting" Panel Discussion. Starting at 12:30. Members are invited to bring a panel that they would like some advice on how to do more than SOB, aka 'Slap on Border."


