PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Happy May QGI!

I'm going to enjoy the month of May with more time outside and beautiful May flowers, but I'm also thinking ahead to October when we are going to have a large auction of small quilts (both a live and silent auction) at our general evening meeting on October 12. And I'm asking you to be working ahead for that fun auction.

Please consider making and donating one or more small quilts for the large auction of small quilts. We would like to have beautiful quilts that have been made recently and <u>have a label attached</u> to indicate who made it. It could be a wall hanging, a baby quilt, a table runner, a miniature quilt, or a framed quilt. We will also accept purses or other quilt related accessories. If you wish, you may write a statement about the quilt that you would like us to share before or during the auction. Connie Lancaster has kindly agreed to lead the large auction of small quilts and be our auctioneer for the event!

You may start bringing small quilts for the auction to any of our meetings; they can be turned into <u>Connie Lancaster, Joyce Blakely, Maureen Weflen, or Betsy LaBell.</u> We would like you to share them at show and tell. Once they are turned in, we will photograph them and start sharing them at upcoming QGI meetings and on the QGI website and/or social media to help advertise the quilt auction. Mary White made and donated these two great quilts for the auction!





Also, Dina Varano recently contacted QGI through our website and decided to generously donate a number of hand-quilted vintage quilts and quilt tops made from the 1930 to the 1950s by her grandmother, Ruth King, who lived in Oklahoma and Texas. One of the quilts is a Sunbonnet Sue made by Ruth, her two sisters, and her mother in the 1940s using fabric from their dresses, some of which had been made from flour sacks issued during the Great Depression. Another quilt has some beautiful hand embroidered flowers. These quilts and quilt tops will be included in the October quilt auction (even though these are not small).

The location for the October QGI meeting will be different and the meeting may even start earlier than normal. More details about that will be coming soon. Stay tuned. You can invite friends and neighbors to come to the October QGI meeting.

Betsy LaBell welcomed everyone to the April QGI meeting in the Lounge of Orchard Park Presbyterian Church. Members with April birthdays were invited to choose a gift from a selection of fun items.

Libby Gilbert introduced Caryl Bryer Fallert-Gentry who presented her program "Pixels and Pizzazz". Caryl grew up and lived in the Chicago area where she made her first quilt in 1975. Ten years later she was showing her quilts in national quilt shows. She moved to Paducah, Kentucky where she had a studio. After her husband died, she met a wonderful man and remarried in 2011. They now live in Washington state where she has a beautiful studio with views of the ocean and forest that surrounds her home. In 1984 she began dying her own fabrics. She also designs fabrics for commercial use. For many years she has only used commercial fabrics that she designed or fabrics that she dyed in her quilts. She enjoys photography and also uses images that she creates on her computer to print fabrics that she uses in her quilts. The presentation was recorded and posted on the guild website.

The thank you blocks made for Marcia Hackett, the 2022 Quilt Show co- chair, were displayed. The blocks were made by guild members in the quilt show colors of royal blue, green and white. Marcia watched the presentation online.

SPEAKER: AMY FRIEND: "AN INTRODUCTION TO THE MODERN QUILTING AESTHETIC"

Amy Friend will give a presentation on "An Introduction to the Modern Quilting Aesthetic." Amy will discuss her personal sewing history and evolution in addition to showing samples of her work.

Amy is a former museum curator turned designer. She designs modern quilts and specializes in paper pieced designs. She authored the books Intentional Piecing (2016) and Improv Paper Piecing: A Modern Approach to Quilt Design (2017), and has a new book, Petal + Stem (2020). Since 2019, Amy has run a paper pieced Block of the Month program each year. She is an award winning quilter and her quilts have been exhibited at a number of quilt shows as well as museums. Amy is a national quilt teacher and lecturer. Amy lives in Massachusetts with her husband and three children. Two important events for QGIN in June are an Introduction to EQ8 lecture by Lynn Thomas on June 2, 2023.

QGI members often mention using this program to help create their quilts, but many people have little or no experience with this program. Some bought earlier versions, but haven't kept up with the updates. Lynn will give us an overview of the kind of things that EQ8 can do and will share the ways she has found to use the program to create quilts.

June 3, 2023 is the date for an amazing workshop by Mary Strinka on the technique she has mastered, Stack N Whack Quilts. Mary is willing to offer fabric consultations to anyone who has questions about the fabric they are considering using. More information on registering is on the next page..

(Note: Maureen Weflen took Mary's class before and it was so much fun that she has registered to take it again! Mary has made over 40 of the Stack and Wack (or One Block Wonder) quilts and has a great variety of settings for these quilts.

Workshop

Mary Strinka – Let's Play Stack 'n Whack

Saturday, June 3, 2023 Zionsville Town Hall 1100 W. Oak Street, Room 207, Zionsville, IN 46007 Arrive before 9:00 AM – Class starts at 9:00 AM and ends at 5:00 PM

Mary will step you through the hands-on process of starting a Stack 'n Whack project.

You choose a fabric. Need help choosing? (Email <u>marystrinka@gmail.com</u> or text 317-205-7337). If you need help determining the pattern repeat, your favorite quilt shop employees should be able to advise you.

Plan to buy at least 6 pattern repeats. If your fabric has a 24" repeat (common in large scale prints), that is 4 yards. Do not prewash your fabric.

We will work together to study the scale of the fabric printing and decide what size triangles (or squares) will work with your fabric. We will step through the process of aligning, pinning, and preparing your fabric for cutting. Then we'll cut and start sewing.

This is a full-day, in-person workshop. Lunch? You can bring your own, or make a run to many nearby restaurants.

WHAT HAPPENED AT THE QGIN SEA GLASS WORKSHOP?

Wow! What a day of fun and fellowship! Pam Durant and Maureen Weflen teamed up to put on a fun workshop on how to make a Sea Glass wall-hanging. Maureen shared many ideal fabrics, some were even fused, plus a wide variety of strips of fabric from her stash. Speaking of sharing, Mary Strinka surprised us with yardage of fabric she had rust died ages ago. She wanted the fabric to get used, so many of the attendees "helped her out" by using it for the background/beach fabric for this project.

Pam shared examples of how to create a beach with sea glass. She started with a short history of the sources of old glass and common colors. Pam brought many inexpensive container examples as a way to organize the different colors of glass while working on this project.

Each attendee was able to get a great start on a project that fit their needs. For example, Michelle Hoel took inspiration from a couple of photos she took of interesting rock formations. Martha Higdon didn't have much time, so she utilized Maureen's pre-fused fabrics, and with the help of many creative consultations by others and extra fabric fused by Lynn Thomas she was able to get a great start on her Sea Glass Project.

Maureen used a background that represented a volcanic beach she had visited in Iceland. Mary Strinka had planned ahead and created a sandy beach with a gently curved water line. She caught on to this new technique immediately, and was able to finish it the next day.

Things made available for people to finish their Sea Glass project were supplied by Maureen—nice pieces of left over batting—and Pam had some yardage of rock fabric which was great for backing. Enjoy a few photos of workshop below.

When I heard last month that Sacred Threads was looking for a new team to keep it going, I hoped someone would volunteer. I mulled on it several days and realized that since she had been looking for at least a year, and the information was still on the website, that maybe someone hadn't stepped up. I didn't want to be that person, but I wanted to see it here. So I filled out the inquiry form and said, I hope you have someone, but just in case, I would look into the feasibility of Indy. She IMMEDIATELY responded and wanted to set up a time to talk and said many had talked of support, but no one had said they wanted to take it on. I knew I would need two big things: to move the year of the biennial show so it would not be on the same schedule as our show, and I would

need a team, a strong one, that could take over when I move. I thought about how Lafayette quilter, Mary Bunte, had loved the show. I sent out an email to many quilters and right away got a call from Pam Mick who was so thrilled and said, she thought it needed to be here for Mary and that she would support it and make sure it survived my leaving. News From The Quilters Hall of Fame 926 S. Washington St. Marion, Indiana



On Tuesday May 9 the Quilters Hall of Fame will open with the 1876 Centennial Quilt Project which will be open through July 29. After discovering an extraordinary guilt from Connecticut in an online quilt history forum and securing permission from its owner, a guilt group from Northwest Washington began the journey of patterning the 1876 Centennial Quilt. Set in a unique Medallion-style arrangement, this guilt contains over 70 individual block patterns. The exhibit will feature the original quilt along with 14 contemporary quilts made from its pattern. Each quilt maker skillfully and beautifully interpreted the original guilt and the guilts represent a wide variety of styles. We invite you to enjoy the quilts, read the stories and begin your own journey with the 1876 Centennial Quilt. Curated by Anne Dawson.
